

"Lambda Chi and Lehigh changed my life – it really did. Here's how. We had such a wide range of characters with serious students, talented intramural athletes, and bizarre brothers (the names are well known, trust me) that you got to experience everything. Had we been the house of all Lehigh baseball players, for example, we would have truly missed out. And most interesting of

all in the mid 70's, we had open—read unsupervised—band parties. On occasion, we had six or seven on the Hill blaring live music on a Saturday night.

Several of those first Gamma-Psi friendships remain to this day, and I'm sure other brothers in later classes would say much the same. Surprisingly many of the specific details of this night in 1975 or that incident in 1976 exists in great detail and memory. And there is an abundance of fine, photographic evidence in many, many unscripted shots taken by house photographers (thanks, Glen Wagner) to fill in the blanks.

As fate would have it, the chapter provided the moment when I met my future wife and yes, even a photo exists of that for a great personal memory. When I came back to Lehigh after 2 years to start on an MBA, Gamma-Psi was home again for me in 1978-79 (thanks, Jeff) and another round of new friendships. Undoubtedly with so many positive experiences there, my career turned sharply toward working full-time in the university environment – including Lehigh for a dozen years – and continues that way today as a CIO. In between we sent four children through Lehigh, although one became a Sig Ep which I'll never understand, and got back when we could for the home football games.

But it all started with a double room on the third floor at Gamma-Psi."
