Walt Keiper '85 Shares His Story

For Walt Keiper, Lambda Chi Alpha has become much more than a part of his past. Since he graduated in 1985, he's kept close ties with the chapter.

In fact, his first gig after graduation was working as a chapter consultant for Lambda Chi Alpha.

"After that, I went to work for Lehigh for five years as the Associate Director of

Residential Services, basically handling Greek housing and residence hall housing while I got my MBA," Walt said.

While he was at Lehigh, he couldn't serve on the board because of his position in Residential Services. However, after earning his MBA and getting a new job, Walt joined the Housing Corporation and served as president for a period of time. Now, he remains on the board—a testament to his commitment to the chapter and his appreciation for his Lambda Chi experience.

As an undergrad, he served as treasurer and president and recalls the value of both those leadership experiences. Not only did he learn to lead a group, but he gained some business experience while he served as treasurer.

He also recalls participating in the chapter's very first leadership retreat for



officers. "When I was president, we did our first leadership retreat as officers. We went away for a weekend, which was never done before. We focused on goal-setting and planning for the year."

One of his proudest moments came during his senior year.

"The chapter was awarded with the Grand High Alpha

Award, which was the outstanding chapter of the year award," he said. "I think it was a lot of hard work but a

great learning experience. That's why I went to work for Lambda Chi Alpha as a chapter consultant. We operate two stadiums, seated movie theatres, an amphitheater, a large restaurant, and bar operations. Now, I'm the Senior Vice President of Business Administration."

Walt has two daughters (12 and 14) with Betsy Kline, his wife of 16 years. In his spare time, he's starting playing tennis again. He played at Lehigh and now plays weekly and is part of the United States Tennis Association's Adult League Program.
